Discriminative Tariff Not Disastrous. ST. PETERSBURG, July 2 (Tuesday)—When secretary Gage's action imposing duties on Russian sugar exported to the United States was followed by such a disproportionate reprisal (the imposition of 30 per cent increased duties on the most important American imports here) the importers of American tools and machinery were disposed to support Russia on the legal aspects, but some of them examined the matter and concluded that the Russian sugar regulations amount to practical compulsion to manufacture for export.

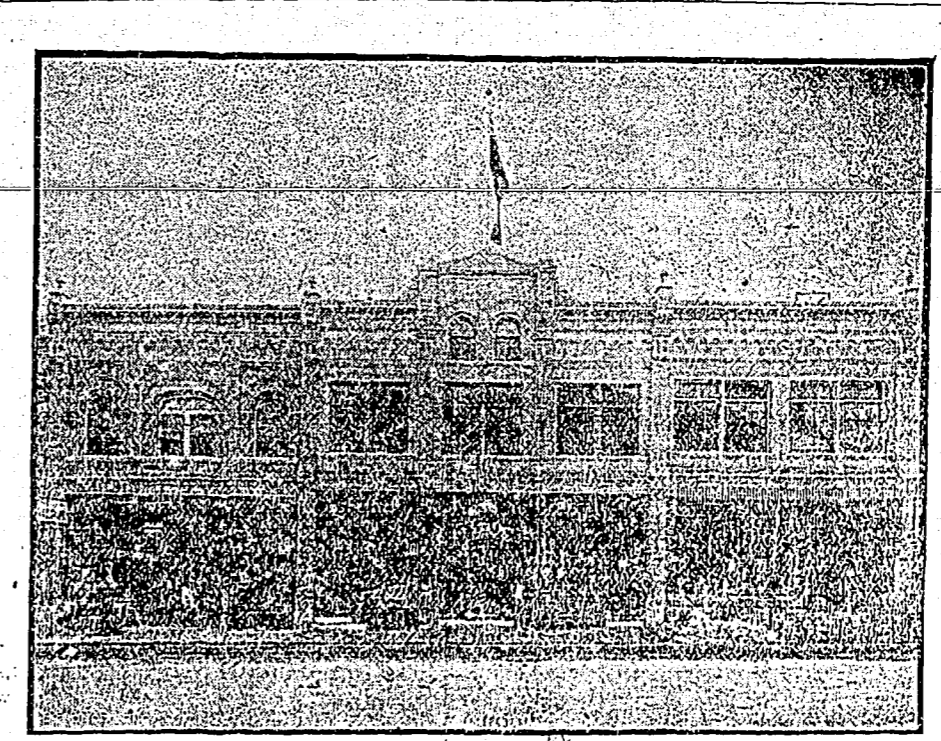
