NELSON, B. C. adians hold their own with them in all outdoor sports, and surely Canada can raise enough money to give them a go for the America's cup. If the money cannot be raised any other way, let it be raised by public subscriptions. The consensus of political opinion in Nelson is that a government with Hon. D. M. Eberts as premier could not possibly go to the country and win. This opinion is based, largely, on the belief that Hon. Mr. Eberts is not in touch with the people on any one of the questions that are now considered issues. He belongs to the old Victoria regime that no longer have a standing outside of Victoria and Cariboo. Kootenay and Yale districts are now peopled by men who cannot see why the straits of Georgia should divide the province into two politically hostile divisions; they cannot be made understand why the word Mainland should be spelled with a cap M, and the word Island with a cap I. Neither can they be made believe that all the political wisdom of the province is concentrated in the City of Victoria. These people do not know David MacEwan Eberts, and David MacEwan has passed the time of life when he can make himself known so as to become a successful factor in politics. When the police become so partisan as to assist corporations in wreaking their vengeance on individuals, it is time for common people to put in office only men who will see that the laws are enforced fairly by fair-minded officials. In three months the present council will be putting the city hall in order for their successors. None of the present aldermen, so it is said, care to stand for re-election. Mayor Fletcher wants another term, but he will not get it as a gift. Alderman Selous would like to be mayor, and his friends are putting out feelers to find how he stands with the people. The boys who take an interest in municipal politics are training a dark horse, with the intention of entering him in the race. If he takes kindly to his training, he will be a winner. The incident at Rossland yesterday shows all too clearly that there is one law for one class of citizens and another law for another class. Men who band themselves together and call themselves a Miner's Union are not treated by the men who are paid to enforce the law as are the men who band themselves together and call themselves a Mine Owners' Association. Some day there will be a reckoning.
